- a) Allocations and Finance Committee
- S. Massel highlighted that A&F is working on three applications, noting one will be coming next month and that two are still incomplete.
- b) Communications Committee
- B. Paddock highlighted on behalf of A. Dias that she has been in touch with eSolutions regarding the website and she will be arranging a meeting with them as soon as possible to discuss next steps.
- B. Paddock also noted the date of the AGM will be Tuesday, June 9th, 2015. It was highlighted that the AGM will be held at the Regional Headquarters building. Foundation members suggested that archives be open and potentially provide tours that night.

He noted that on April 25th, WHS will have an exhibit and book table at the Kitchener Public Library Genealogy Fair.
- J. Glass stated the next public meeting is Saturday, May 23rd at Galt's Knox Presbyterian Church in Cambridge. He stated the guest speaker is Cambridge-Galt author, researcher and columnist David Menary talking about "Frederick Douglass in Galt". Douglass, described as "the continent's best-known ex-slave" came to Galt to give a talk during Galt's winter lecture series in December 1857, just 3 years before the start of the American Civil War.
